Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone

Our term has started very strongly with children excited about this term's exciting events - especially our school Film Festival and the school camp for our Year 5 and 6 students. The roll is also continuing to grow steadily and today we have 565 students, and we should move past 570 before the end of term. For the past two years or more we have been unable to take out of zone students and this has not changed. We are, however, very keen to know about any in zone children who will be coming to St Martins School. If you have a child due to start this year, or next year, or know of someone who is intending to come to St Martins, please let us know as soon as possible. Early notification really does help us plan our staffing and it is very useful when speaking to the Ministry of Education about this.

We have had a couple of enquiries about the 'cohort entry' process that has been allowed since changes were made to the Education Act. The St Martins School Board of Trustees has not yet discussed this as a possibility so at this point in time children can only start as early as their 5th birthday. (The 'Cohort Entry' would allow children to start at the beginning of the term closest to their 5th birthday, or the beginning of a term later. So it would mean a child could start up to two months before they turn 5, while others may have to wait for two months after their 5th birthday). There is a detailed process which includes consultation before any change can be considered. So until further notice it will be status quo for St Martins School.

Mt Vernon Park 2017 planting day Saturday August 26, 9am Where: End of Albert Terrace

You are invited to come along and plant trees and shrubs to help beautify our valley and make it a more attractive place for native birds. We have about 1000 eco-sourced native tree and shrub seedlings from the Department of Conservation nursery at Motukarara to plant. This is our third year of planting in that area, and with the wetter season trees from the first two years are noticeably flourishing. You need to bring: a spade, clothing suitable for the weather, food and drink if you need it. Children need to be supervised. If the weather is awful on Saturday we will hold it on Sunday 27th at 9am.

Please Note. A lot of the planting will be higher up on the valley side between the stands of gorse and broom. The land is fairly rough with hidden holes and under-runners. Care is needed. For the less fit there will be planting areas lower down. It's a good opportunity to be involved in improving your local area, and we'd love to see you there.
