During last week we had the pleasure of a visit from the Education Review Office (ERO). The team of four spent most of the week evaluating St Martins School and its performance. Last Thursday the Board of Trustees received informal feedback from the review team and this was very positive. We are very excited about receiving the final report which should arrive in the New Year.

Build Update:

Best laid plans of mice and men!! The Board has just been informed that the Ministry of Education did not meet the deadline for placing the tender for the building work for St Martins School. This means that the tenders are now likely to close at the end of January to early February, so it is most likely the building will start in the holidays at the end of Term 1. We have asked the Ministry to keep us informed of updates and as we receive information you will also be informed.

End of Year Assemblies:

On Monday and Tuesday of next week we have our final assemblies. On **Monday 18th December starting at 1.30pm** we have our Rehearsal/Penultimate Assembly.
