Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone

Earlier this week you will have seen the School Links email message warning about an incident where one of our students was approached by a stranger.

These sorts of events, while unsettling, do remind us that we do need to prepare our children so that they are safe going to, or coming home from school, or when walking at other times.

We understand that it may not always be possible to walk with your child, so here are some tips to consider.

Children should:

- Walk with a friend when possible
- Pick a safe route, and review the route regularly to ensure there are no dangers (like new roadworks)
- Make sure children know that they must stick to the route, and resist the temptation to take shortcuts or different routes with friends
- Never take a ride from a stranger, and if offered a lift make sure this information is passed on immediately to an adult (parent - school)
- Teach your child how you wish them to respond to strangers who they might encounter
- Identify some safe houses along the route, where family friends live where they can stop in case of trouble
- Keep in mind other 'everyday' safety messages about crossing roads, knowing where to cross roads, and to cross safely, safe use of scooter or bicycle. They are things children will need to know to keep themselves safe.

The big message is really that of awareness. When children know what to do and why, there is always a much greater chance of good choices being made.

Having regular conversations and checking that children are continuing to act safely in how they come to and from school, are important things to do.
