Over the past two weeks teachers from Year 4 to 8 have held 'Goal Setting' conferences. These are an important and essential part of our processes for reporting to parents about the learning of their children. Thank you for taking the time to be there and also for being active participants in these conversations with your children about their learning and for being part of determining next steps. Some of you may have noticed that Mrs May and I were 'sitting in' on some of these Goal Setting conferences. We did this for the first time about two years ago so that we could see and feel, first hand, what this important tool for sharing student learning was actually like when being delivered.

As a result of those visits we were able to make some enhancements. These recent visits were to check that these enhancements were in place and that our process was doing what it was supposed to, in a consistent and appropriate way across the school. A special thank you must go to those brave children and parents who allowed us to observe.

Quite frequently we experience people leaving bicycles and scooters at school overnight and sometimes over the weekend.
