It feels quite evident that Winter is coming. The mornings have been colder and darker, and we can probably expect them to be a little wetter also. We ask that extra care is taken when dropping children off, or picking them up, and that any driving manoeuvres are safe and legal. We also ask that courtesy is shown to our school neighbours and additional care is taken not to park over driveways. Your co-operation with these requests would be most appreciated.

#### **Dealing with concerns**

From time to time you may have a concern or questions that you would like answers to about your child's learning or wellbeing. Please don't hesitate to make contact at the earliest point of concern. For classroom concerns or questions, please speak to your child's teacher in the first instance. If it is something that they are unable to answer, the teacher will tell you who is best to ask. If it is something of a more general or serious nature, a senior teacher, the deputy principal or the principal may be better placed to provide the answers. We do encourage you to start with the teacher, especially if it is a classroom related issue.
