Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone.

The year is now in full swing across the school and children are keen to get down to their learning. You can support your children with this by making sure that they arrive in plenty of time each day. This is important for socialisation but also to ensure that each child is ready to start the day's work. Children who arrive late can often feel disconnected from their class and take more time to get up to speed. So plan that trip to school so that your children arrive with time to spare.

It is wonderful to see so many children walking, scooting and cycling to school. This is a great option for our environment and it eases traffic congestion in the mornings and after school.

Please, if your child has a scooter, can you find a way to 'tag' it with a name or a cell phone number. So often scooters are left behind at school and reuniting them with their owners can take weeks, even months. We do ask that children walk their bicycles and scooters into and out of the school grounds for safety reasons. Please support us with this, especially after school when everyone is leaving over a short space of time and there is not sufficient space for safe cycling or scooting in a very tight area.

Parking outside of school - As we start this school year please remember some simple courtesies.

- Please refrain from parking over driveways
- The "Drop off Zone" is just that so please refrain from parking in this area.
- Be patient and wait until you are in the "Drop off Zone" before letting your children leave the vehicle, it is a ticketing offence and the Christchurch City Council wardens will be visiting at random intervals.
- If you or your child has a disability that makes walking distance difficult, please speak to us about an 'in school drop off option'.

## **School Health Notices**

#### 2017 Year 8 School Based HPV Vaccination Programme.

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) is a common viral infection which can cause several cancers affecting both men and women later in life. Early HPV immunisations offers the best protection against contracting this virus. **Both girls and boys in Year 8** will now be offered free HPV vaccination through the school based programme.

A new updated version of the vaccine will cover more strains of the virus, providing cover with 2 instead of 3 doses. The vaccination will continue to be available at your GP however the Public Health Service encourage the school based programme. Parents of Year 8 students should receive a consent form this week. If you would like your child to receive the HPV vaccination at school then the consent form needs to be completed and returned to school by Wednesday 15th February. The Public Health Nurse has asked that all forms are completed and returned, even if you do not wish to make use of this programme. #### Free Dental Health Care with special information for Year 8 students

One of our Community Dental Service preventative mobiles is currently at St Martins School. We are aiming to see that all school aged children enrolled with the Community Dental Service have their dental check-up in the dental mobile while it is at school.

The dental therapist will check, x-ray and clean teeth and apply protective treatments (including fluoride) if required. If your child requires further care such as fillings they will bring home a 'Care Plan' which will explain treatment and appointment times. You will then need to arrange an appointment to take them to the Community Dental Service to have the treatment completed.

**Year 8 students** - All Year 8 students enrolled with the Dental Service are transferred from the Community Dental Service to a FREE private dentist from Year 9 until their 18th birthday. To help with this transition please ensure you have informed your child of their family dentist (not orthodontist). This will enable us to transfer your child onto the correct dentist for Year 9 onwards.
