Newsletters are sent home fortnightly on a Thursday. This term our newsletters will be sent home on 23rd April, 7th May, 21st May, 4th June, 18th June and 2nd July. These newsletters and the S'Mart Community newsletters can also be found on our school website.

The roll continues to grow with 521 children at our school today. We are certainly back to preearthquake numbers, and with the loss of some classroom space we are tight for classroom accommodation. Consequently, the zone will remain closed. We wish to keep class sizes at a manageable level, relevant to the age of the children, (eg: we like to maintain class sizes of around 16 for New Entrants to ensure a strong start) but this means we use more space. Accepting out of zone enrolments at this time would impact on this strategy. The Board of Trustees is supporting our strategy of maintaining the lowest possible class sizes whilst ensuring that our special learning programmes and other support programmes are readily available.

With the start of a new term this is the time to make sure that your children arrive on time and are ready to start the day. Classes start at **8.50am** and children need to be present and ready to go! The impact that regular lateness has on the individual child is significant, without mentioning the disruption it can cause while a teacher 'catches' the child up. Please make every effort to ensure that your child is early for school.

Unsurprisingly there has been a huge amount of publishing to commemorate the 100th anniversary of World War 1 and amongst it are some lovely picture books in particular. Glvn Harper's Le Quesnoy tells the story of the French town liberated by the New Zealand Division in 1918 without any loss of civilian life. David Metzenthen looks at the Remembrance Day in his powerful One Minute's Silence supported by striking, barren illustrations the reader is invited to imagine how much can be remembered in one minute, looking at forces on both sides of the war and finally realising that the individual soldiers are not so different from each other. The image of disinterested youngsters at the front changing to alert individuals as the book finishes is very powerful. For younger readers Peter Millett's The Anzac Puppy tells the forgotten tale of Freda, the official mascot of the New Zealand Rifle Brigade who provided love, warmth and friendship to the Kiwi soldiers so far away from home.
