Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone.

With winter sneaking up on us it is noticeably colder and darker in the mornings. Surprisingly one of the things we are seeing is that some children are arriving earlier and earlier. Sometimes as early as 7.45am. There is a 'Homework Club' service which opens at 7.30am going through to 8.40am (www.thehomeworkclub.co.nz phone 021 2741962) which offers supervision for children arriving early on a regular basis, or on those occasions where an early drop off is essential. It needs to be understood that our first bell rings at 8.30am and children are not supervised prior to this time. We ask all parents and caregivers to be mindful of children's safety, especially during these wintery months. On some mornings there are some organised events like music lessons, sport practices or mathematics club and this might give the impression of an earlier supervised opening time for all comers. That is not the case. For your child's safety we ask that parents and caregivers manage the arrival of children between 8.20am and 8.45am so that children are safe before school and ready on time to start school.

Some minor works will be starting at St Martins from the week of 25th May. The work will be in the afternoons/evenings (3.30pm to 6pm) and involves the grinding of trip hazards and filling of dips, as well as fixing some of the areas where water pools. This work should take about 3 weeks all going well.

Digital Technology and Cybersafety

As the result of an internal review we are updating our Digital Technology and Cybersafety Responsible User agreement with students. These changes reflect the evolution of Cybersafety with its focus on keeping students, equipment, and information safe; to digital citizenship with its broader focus of competence, awareness, and responsibility. Part of the process will include lessons, outlining the Responsible User agreement and what roles and responsibilities we all have when using the technology at school. This new policy will be uploaded on our SchoolDocs site and our school website.

School Production

We are all getting very excited about the upcoming St Martins School Production! There will be two performances to be held at The Aurora Centre, Burnside High School on Wednesday 1st July and Thursday 2nd July. Performances start at 7pm. There will be two rehearsals at the venue on the mornings of Tuesday 30th June and Wednesday 1st July - children will be transported to the venue from school for these rehearsals. More information will come out closer to the time.




St Martins School Policy Review Reporting to Parents Policy

SAFE PARKING PRACTICES



The wet weather sometimes means that good parking practice is forgotten and even during good weather there can be issues with parking. Wherever you park, ensure you are parking in a safe and legal way. The safety of our children must always be more of a priority than getting the closest park to the school gates. Unfortunately we are still finding a small handful of parents and caregivers who are not willing to walk a bit further to ensure they have parked in a safe way. One continued area of concern is the corner of Roscoe Street and Lascelles Street.

Cars are often seen parking (illegally) on or extremely close to the corner of these streets. Cars parking in this manner make it impossible for children to see what is coming as they are trying to cross the road, and for other vehicles to see the children. Please consider child safety over your own convenience.
