Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone.

The first stage for our school renewal project is underway. The Board of Trustees is currently in the process, with the Ministry of Education, and a small cluster of schools, of appointing an architect to restart our Master Planning for our rebuild. It is expected that this part of the process will be completed over the next few weeks. The work proper on Master Planning will start at the end of this year or very early next year and should be completed by around April 2016. The detailed planning is expected to be completed following this with construction beginning in October 2016 and completed by the end of 2017. These are the expected timeframes based on the information supplied by the Ministry of Education. As things develop we will keep you informed.

You may have noticed CCC traffic wardens visible outside St Martins School and they have spoken with some parents (with some parents not being respectful). However this is about our children's safety and parents need to know that there will be no further warnings and tickets will be issued for parking infringements. Traffic wardens will continue to patrol the areas outside our school at random at regular intervals to ensure safe parking practices are being followed.

Scooters:

It is wonderful to see children coming to school by scooter, however, what is puzzling is why so many take a different form of transport on the way home. On many nights of the week the caretaker can collect between 10 and 15 scooters that have been left behind. These are generally locked in his shed for safe keeping. Please be aware that this is done out of good will and there may be some nights when this is just not possible. While we will do our best, the school can not take responsibility for 'forgotten' scooters! There are some guidelines the caretaker has suggested should be shared with your children at home please.

- On arrival place scooter in the racks or hooks provided. Scooters should not be left in entrance ways as they can be tripping hazards.
- If you can, lock your scooter to the stand.
- Please remove scooters by 4pm. If attending an after school activity please remove the scooter before the activity and take it with you.
- Scooters must be named. The underside of the scooter is the most suitable place for this.
- Please don't scoot down the driveway or through pedestrians immediately outside the gate after school.
- Please check with the caretaker as soon as possible after you realise a scooter has been forgotten (Some can be there for months before being collected)

We appreciate your co-operation in sharing and reminding your children about these 'scooter guidelines'. We will do the same from our end. Thank you.
