Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone.

Term 3 is underway and we expect it to be an exciting 10 weeks of learning. During the break 4 more classrooms underwent modifications to enhance collaborative teaching and learning opportunities. Rooms 4 and 5 and Rooms 6 and 7 have been linked internally to provide greater flexibility around how learning can be managed. It looks quite different, and if your children are in one of these rooms, or if you are interested, please feel free to have a look before or after school.

St Martins School is now beginning the process that will lead to our rebuild starting in the second half of 2016. The first step has been to appoint our Architect. Baldasso Cortesse have been selected and the Board of Trustees will meet with the 'lead-team' in the near future. This will be an exciting, though demanding time as we work through a rigorous programme that will ensure the best possible outcome for the community of St Martins School today and into the future. We will make sure that as each step is taken you will be kept informed, and involved as much as possible.

Please remember that traffic wardens will be monitoring the area outside the school in the mornings and afternoons at random intervals. They will be looking to ensure traffic behaviours are safe and legal. There are unlikely to be any warnings given. This is about our children's safety, and also about us respecting our neighbours by parking legally.

# Off the Shelf



Using the Library Catalogue #1 Children can log-on from home to check what books they have out on loan. what needs to be returned/renewed and if there are reservations to be collected. Go to the library catalogue homepage (via School website/ learning/library), click on MY LIBRARY on left side, then borrowing detail. You will be prompted for the borrower ID. For a huge majority of the children this is first 3 letters of the surname followed by first 3 letters of the first name. ALL IN CAPITALS, no spaces - I would be HAYBRI. If this doesn't work it is due to the same string already having been assigned to another child. We will need to check to see how this has been amended. From here your child can check their loans and see if there are any reservations ready to be collected - great to do the day before their library lesson.
