Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone.

On that note, each Friday the school holds a whole school assembly. The assembly is a great opportunity for us to celebrate some of the amazing things that happen at our school while we are learning at St Martins. Each week our student leaders introduce special items, like our weekly "Heart of the School Award" that acknowledges special or remarkable efforts of our students; or our fun whole-school singing that gets everyone moving! The parking and drop off behaviours have been much improved this term, and we thank you for your co-operation with this. It is, after all, in the first instance about the safety of our children and secondly about respectful behaviour towards our neighbours who need to access their properties unhindered. We expect the CCC wardens to return over the next few weeks so please keep up the great effort.

At St Martins we are, generally speaking, fortunate that the behaviour of our children reflects the Values and Beliefs of the school. From time to time however, things will happen. It is a part of growing up and learning and no school is immune. What is important is that each time we are aware of, or suspect something that does not reflect our Values and Beliefs is happening, action is taken. St Martins has strong and rigorous systems for dealing with any issues, and we encourage children to share with us at the earliest possible time. Because of this most of the time it is 'small stuff' that we deal with, but we work through the issue to eliminate the root cause rather than just the symptom. Keeping the school informed is the first step. If there is an issue please speak with your child's teacher at the earliest possible time. Please don't leave it, as most things can be solved very easily, and no issue is too small. We have a safe learning environment at St Martins and together we can keep it that way.

Ill children? We have been experiencing very high numbers of unwell children. The flu that is doing the circuit is just 'warming up' from all accounts and for children and staff who have experienced it, it is a severe strain. Please, if your children are unwell, keep them at home until they are fully recovered.

Albert Terrace Planting Day - Saturday 29th August 9am

We are holding our first planting day on the 3 hectares of land at the end of Albert Terrace which was purchased as an extension to Mt Vernon Park late last year. The land is in pretty rough condition at the moment, mostly covered in gorse and broom. We have cleared broom out of a couple of the side gullies and will concentrate this year's planting in those areas. We have purchased 1000 native tree seedlings from the DOC nursery at Motokarara.

What you need to bring: a spade, a bag for carrying a few trees up the slope, clothing suitable for the weather, food and drink if you need it. Children need to be supervised.

It's a good opportunity to be involved in improving your local area, and we'd love to see you there. If the weather is awful on Saturday we will hold it on Sunday 30th at 9am.

Free Dental Care for Children

One of our Community Dental Service preventive mobiles will be visiting school soon for a short visit.

- We will be aiming to see children enrolled with the Community Dental Service that are due a dental check-up along with Year 8 children enrolled in our service. We will not be seeing all children at this visit
- The dental therapist will not only be checking the children's teeth but will also Xray, clean and apply protective treatments (including fluoride) if required.
- If your child requires further dental care such as fillings they will bring home a 'Care Plan' which will explain what dental care and appointment times are required.
- When you receive the 'Care Plan' please contact our **Call Centre as soon as possible** as you will need to arrange a time to bring your child to one of our Community Clinics for this dental care.
- Please let us know asap if you do not wish your child to have any of this care, you can talk to the staff
 in the mobile or phone/email our Call Centre
- If you wish to be present at your child's check up this will need to take place at our community clinic so please phone/email our **Call Centre** to make an appointment.
- If your child is not seen at this visit the mobile is planned to return for a longer visit in Term 4 when the majority of the children are due their annual check-up.
- Please contact our Call Centre if you want further information on the Community Dental Service, to enrol your child or if you have any specific questions about your child's dental care (a dental therapist will call you back).
