Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone.

Once again welcome back to Term 4 at St Martins School. This is a short term with a great deal being packed into it, and we know that it will be a busy and exciting one.

As you will be aware, sun hats are required to be worn from the start of Term 4. Sun safety is once again a focus as we move towards summer. It is important to start sun-safe behaviours now so that the habits of sun safety are as natural as clicking on a seat belt when we get into a car. Start with sunscreen applications in the morning and make sure that your child, especially those with fair skin, have a supply of lotion in their bags for application during the day. (Emergency supplies are held in most classrooms and in the office)

Teachers will begin making general reminders about 'application' at break times and there will also be 'whole school' reminders via the intercom on those days when there is the greatest risk. It is important that we work together, home and school, to make sure that the habits of keeping sun-safe are well learned.

Scooters being left behind at school continues as an issue. We ask that scooters are labelled with a name somewhere on the scooter. This way we can provide a reminder to those who have forgotten that they have left their scooter behind. Please remember that while our caretaker, Paul, generally takes care to place scooters left behind safely in his shed, this is not always possible so we cannot guarantee that this will happen every night.

Please endeavour to get your children to school for the start of the school day on time. Our classes start at 8.50am so children need to be here before this time to ready themselves so that they can feel positive about starting learning for the day.

Class placements 2016 - it is now time to speak to us about class placement information that will assist the school in placing your child in the best place possible in 2016. During 2015 our teachers have been working much more collaboratively, and your child will have been working more closely with more than one teacher. In 2016 all classes will be located in spaces that much better accommodate the collaborative approach. What is still important for us to know about are any insights into your child's needs as this is always looked at and valued.

I need to stress that this is not 'pick a teacher' but it is an important opportunity for you speak to us now as we begin the process of organisation of the classes for 2016. Each year, after class lists are published, we have a few parents who say they didn't think it was important and then realised it might be after we have completed this work. Changes are very difficult to make at this late stage so please take this opportunity to engage with the school in this process.


School News
