Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone.

This summer has been quite amazing since returning to school. The warm temperatures supplemented with a few much colder days have certainly made this year's start one to remember. Normally the warmer days are not an issue as our classes do have air conditioning (although it has been under pressure on some days), however, on Fridays when we have a full school assembly in the hall we do have to take the temperature into account. The Friday before last we cancelled assembly because we felt it would have been unbearably warm in the hall. I apologise if this caused any inconvenience. We did send an email and notify parents of this cancellation and this is something we will do each time we need to cancel either because of heat, or more likely because of heavy rain.
