Road Safety Update

Following the publicity over the parking issues there has been some, but not complete improvement in the illegal behaviours of some 'parkers'. Last week I met with the Christchurch City Council (CCC) Senior Parking Compliance Officer to discuss how the CCC can assist with the 'Chaos at the Gate'. While the CCC representative said the CCC had not received an direct complaints he could see that we do have issues. To that end, for the rest of this term and for Term 2 there will be random visits from the CCC traffic wardens team. Offenders may not be ticketed immediately but can expect to receive their infringement notices by mail. In Term 3 the 'Chaos at the School Gate' programme will be run for St Martins School by the CCC team. More information will follow closer to the date this programme will commence. Until then we ask, for the sake of the safety of our children, that all drivers who drop off or collect children from St Martins to do so as safely and as legally as possible.

S'Mart Community Working Bee



This term the Yr7/8 (High Fliers) syndicate have been studying the refugee crisis. We have been creating annotated maps of a refugees journey, learning about APA referencing and making people become more aware of what we can do to help the Syrian refugees.

A refugee is a person who has fled their hometown to seek a safer and happier life. We are holding a Talent Show on Monday 9th May, Week 2, to raise money for refugees. This is for Yr 3-8 only.
