#### **Aquatic Survey Update**

Thanks again to everyone who completed the Aquatic Survey last term. We had 220 responses in total, so feel that we now have a good understanding on our community's expectations and priorities with regards to water safety and swimming programmes at school. This information will help us shape the Aquatic Programme for next year.

#### **Key findings:**

Water Safety is clearly a priority, with 94% of respondents saying they would like their children to receive water safety lessons through school. Our Sports Coordinators are looking into how we can enhance our water safety programme.

While nearly 60% of our students receive swimming lessons outside of school, there is a strong interest in school providing lessons and a real desire to ensure that no children miss out on swimming lessons. Our Sports Coordinators are looking into location and funding options for swimming lessons.
