#### **Property Update**

At our Parent Orientation meeting last week we were not able to provide too much new information about the progress of the 'New Build'. Today the Board of Trustees received notice that tender documents have been released to construction companies to tender a price. Tenders will close on March 6th. We have been told that once a tender has been accepted, things can move quickly so it is still very possible that we will have a Term 2 start for our build. Obviously this is great news and we feel a sense that at last something more constructive is happening. As news comes to hand we will keep you informed.

#### School Uniform - The uniform code is as follows:

Compulsory Uniform:	
Polo shirt	Polar fleece jacket
Bucket Hat (Terms 1 and 4),	Unisex shorts or girls skorts.
Girls/Boys Long socks/Girls tights	s - navy blue
Girls/Boys Ankle socks/hideaway	socks - white or navy blue
Shoes - preferably black but navy	or dark brown are acceptable
Optional Uniform Items:	
Unisex cargo pants	Senior jacket (Year 7-8 only as an alternative to polar fleece)

Unisex cargo pants	Senior jacket (Year 7-8 only as an alternative to polar fleece)
Winter jacket	Girls blue gingham dress (Terms 1 and 4 only)
Long sleeved thermal (navy)	Beanie

Senior scarf (Year 7 - 8 only)

Hair should be worn in a practical style appropriate for school, with long hair neatly tied back. Hair accessories (ties and clips) should be in the school colours - navy, blue, red, black, or white. Ear studs and watches are the only jewellery permitted. The right for children to wear Taonga or items of religious significance will be respected. Make-up, including nail polish, is not permitted. We ask that children follow the uniform code as it is stated. We are seeing variations sneaking in bit by bit. If ribbons are to be worn please ensure that they are regulation colour. There has been quite a proliferation of exotic colours being displayed, more noticeable because of the sheer size of the accessory. School is not the place for fashion statements so we respectfully ask that the uniform code is adhered to please.

# **Performing Arts News**

2018 is looking like another amazing year for the Performing Arts team.Mrs Helen Murray continue to teach on Tuesdays and offer excellent music teaching and learning programmes. Miss Trudy Rowe continues to teach full time in the Arts programme.

Our school is so fortunate to have our Performing Arts programme which is signalled and actioned in the school's Strategic Plan. It is one of the unique differences that makes St Martins School. All students have two full days, working in the Performing Arts, every term, as the programme is linked into the Classroom Release Time timetable.

**Term One** we will be exploring into Aotearoa and the nation's stories through process drama. Process drama is a way of working in drama that focuses on the process of dramatic devising and creation, rather than the finished product of a performance or production. It is a fantastic way of learning and exploring dramatic ways of working.

Term Two we will be exploring Dance.

Year 0-2 will be using text and poetry to explore movement and dance

Year 3-4 will be exploring Bollywood dance.

Year 5-6 will be exploring Cheerleading

Year 7-8 will be exploring Jazz Dance and looking into the unit of "Bound and Free' movement. All students will be working with others to choreograph their own movement pieces.

**Term Three** we have our SCHOOLWIDE PRODUCTION! It is a musical and VERY exciting! The students will work with me, during the term to devise pod/class performance pieces. Every student will be on the stage and shine, shine! All will be revealed for this production later in Term Two.

**Term Four** will be exploring music with beat and rhythm being a focus school wide and playing and reading music as a focus for our Year 3-6 students.

We are continuing with our Year 7 and 8 Arts extension programmes in Dance, Choir, EPAC. These dynamic programmes will be occurring on Wednesday afternoons. EPAC and Dance crew has already begun in Week One and the students are amazing!! There will be plenty of opportunities for these leaders within the Performing Arts to share their learning through performance, throughout the year. A Year 3-6 choir will be up and running for the Christchurch South Schools Music Festival at Hillview Christian School in Term Two. In Term Three and Four, an opportunity will be given to our Year 6-8 students to perform in the Christchurch Schools' Music Festival.

A Year 5-6 Boys Dance crew has been started by Lochie Barrie, a Year 5-6 student at St Martins Schools. I will tautoko (support) Lochie with this fab initiative. Lochie was inspired by our senior boys Dance crew last year. A great number of Year 5-6 boys have opted in to be involved. These boys will be working Tuesday lunchtimes with me. The Concert Band, Rock Band and Percussion group continue with our awesome tutors, coming in to work with our students. Whole school singing will continue on Fridays at our amazing assemblies – you are more than welcome to come and have a jam with us as well! We have exciting teaching and learning programmes being planned and are excited to be working alongside our nga tamariki once again in the creative field of Performing Arts.

We are looking forward to a fabulous year of creativity, exploration, quality learning and teaching, extension, performance and fun.

# **More School Notices**

## Free Dental Care for Children - including special info for Year 8 students

One of our Community Dental Service preventive mobiles will be visiting your school soon. They will be aiming to see that all school age children enrolled with the Community Dental Service have their dental check up in the dental mobile while it is there.

**All Year 8 students** enrolled with the Community Dental Service are transferred to a FREE private dentist from Year 9 until their 18th birthday. To help with this transition please ensure you have informed your child of their family dentist (not orthodontist). This will enable us to transfer your child onto the correct dentist for Year 9 onwards. More information will be sent home after their Year 8 check-up.

The dental therapist will not only be checking the children's teeth but will also xray, clean and apply protective treatments fluoride and/or fissure sealants (coating put on teeth to prevent decay) if required.

If your child requires further dental care such as fillings, they will bring home a 'Care Plan' which will explain what dental care and appointment times are required. When you receive the 'Care Plan' please contact our **Call Centre as soon as possible** as you will need to arrange a time to bring your child to one of our Community Clinics for this dental care.

Please let us know ASAP if you do not wish your child to have any of this care, you can talk to the staff in the mobile or phone/email our Call Centre.

If you wish to be present at your child's check up this will need to take place at our community clinic so please contact our Call Centre to make an appointment. Please also contact the Call Centre if you want further information, to enrol your child or if you have any specific questions about your child's dental care.
