## Inspiring a passion for Learning

### Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone

If you have been at the school after 3pm on some days you will have noticed swarms of people in 'glow-vest' attire wandering around the school, many with clipboards or electronic gadgets. This is because the firms wishing to tender for our rebuild are now in the process of collecting the site-specific information they will need to provide a tender for the build. At last it does feel like something constructive is happening. What we do know is this process will be completed within about two weeks. So the possibility of an end of Term 1 or early Term 2 start is very real. We are aware, however, that council consents may be the most likely cause of any delay. We will continue to keep you informed.

#### **Safety at the School Gate**

While the vast majority of our parent community demonstrate care, courtesy and stay within the law while dropping off or picking up children, we are still seeing some concerning behaviours. During a recent visit by a Christchurch City Council - Road Safety Planner representative after school last week these concerns were confirmed. We are now expecting more frequent visits from CCC traffic wardens. Offenders parking on yellow lines, over driveways, crossing the white line to park on the other side of the road in the wrong direction etc, will have their numbers taken and can expect to be ticketed.

#### **Paid Union Meeting - Wednesday 21st March 1.30pm**

You may have heard in the media that these meetings will be held nationally. For the staff at St Martins School the meeting will be held on **21st March starting at 1.30pm**. As most of our staff are members of the union and are entitled under the Collective Agreement to attend the meeting we are asking that you **collect your child from school at 12.30pm on Wednesday 21st March**. If your child normally attends the Homework Club on Wednesdays, you may like to contact them to ensure that this service will commence at this time. (We have advised the Homework Club of the early finish time)

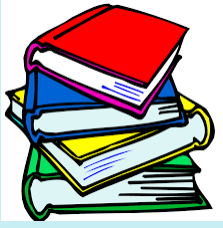

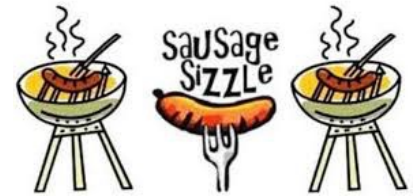
## OFF THE SHELF - News from the School Library

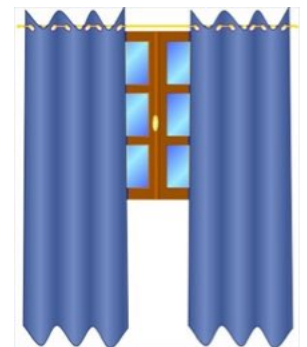
## Student Council News

## BOARD OF TRUSTEES UPDATE

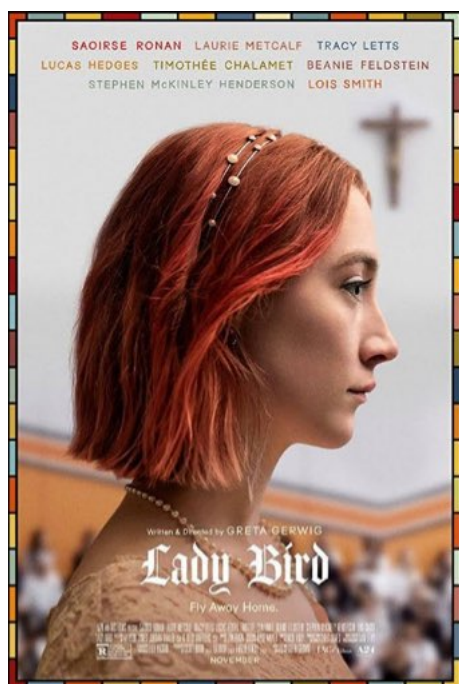
