The latest ERO report is now available on line <u>http://www.ero.govt.nz/review-reports/st-martins-school-23-02-2018/</u> and the link is also on our school website (About>ERO Report) We are pleased to have such a strong report. The report acknowledges the success of the school in the delivery of the curriculum, particularly the high levels of performance in reading, writing and mathematics and the "clearly formulated and enacted interventions in place for children not yet meeting expected levels of achievement." The report considers St Martins to be a high performing school, with strong effective systems and collaborative leadership, and a "relentless focus on continued improvement."

The report also acknowledges the work of our amazing Board of Trustees, and our school's "strong commitment to Te Ao Māori and implementing bicultural practices in ways that are respectful to Māori Culture."

The report highlights the many strengths of our school and states that "our children learn in a highly collaborative, inclusive and positive learning environment."


Have you lost your keys?
