Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone

This week will see the old dental clinic building gone from the school site. This is planned to happen beginning Thursday and being completed by Saturday. We also expect that over the weekend the worksite office will be put in place and the worksite fencing erected.

The teachers have, (and will continue) to remind children that they are not permitted under any circumstances to enter the fenced area. This means either by an opening - or by climbing over or going under!! If balls go over the fence they are to be left and we will arrange retrieval. You will understand the Health and Safety implications and consequently any ignoring of these instructions will be considered as a very serious issue. Please help us keep your children safe by reinforcing this message.

To ensure that we have a record of the build a 'Student Team' has been created to manage the digital recording of the build process and progress. This is an exciting opportunity for our children to take responsibility for recording this historical event in the life of St Martins School.

Please be mindful that next week the build-proper will commence and there may be additional vehicle movement during the school day. These will be halted from around 8am to 9am and between 2.45pm to 3.30pm to allow safe exit and access for children. If you are coming into the school outside of these times please be aware of the possible extra traffic movement.

Our senior team and syndicate teams are putting together an array of alternative activities that will be 'rolled out' during the term and until the completion of the build. This will ensure that our children will have plenty to do to keep themselves active and engaged either by themselves or under supervision. To that end if you feel inclined and have regular availability to support a programme please let Michele in the office know and we can assign you to one of these activities. Regular availability to support would be appreciated but we do understand how busy and committed everyone is.

We have been advised by the NZEI that there is another paid union meeting for teachers to be held in the afternoon on Tuesday 26th June. As most of our staff are members of the union and are entitled under the Collective Agreement to attend the meeting, we are asking that you collect your child from school at 12.30pm (lunchtime) on this day. If you are not able to collect your child at 12.30pm please let us know by phoning the office (ph 332-6121) or emailing admin@stmartins.school.nz so that we can arrange supervision for those children who will remain at school. We have also advised The Homework Club of this early finish. We apologise for the inconvenience that this may cause some of you.

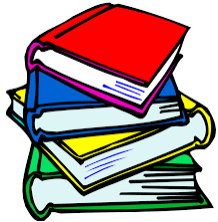
