Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone


Welcome back to Term 2 at St Martins School with a special welcome to our new families. It is going to be a really exciting term as we start the new build. As was communicated over the holiday break by School Links, Hann Construction will put up fencing at the end of Week 2. Up until then it will be business as usual. We will send you a reminder notice again once the fencing is due to go up. Hann Construction will also be adding additional pink painted crosses to indicate where the new building will be. If you get a chance, look out for these and you can get an idea of the shape and size of the first new building.

Below is a picture of our school layout which indicates the fencing plan for the school. The plan takes out much of our court area, including the old dental clinic (which will be removed first) and the parking area in front of the dental clinic. There will be access to the school hall for the Homework Club before and after school. Access to the Homework Club will be through the secondary carpark so it is important to accompany your child when dropping off and picking up.
