It's hard to believe that we have just over two weeks left in this term! In that two weeks, and the two weeks of the holidays we will have to manage the shift from the classrooms in the two storey block to the new classrooms, (as well as some double shifts) and also temporarily move the office to the new library area until the end of the year.

There is a considerable amount to be done in a very short time, and we anticipate, that with Easter and Anzac Day holidays falling during the break, the pressure will be on for everything to be up and ready for day one! Because of this there is a **Staff Only day for the first day of Term 2**, **Monday 29th April** which you may have seen on the school calendar on the school website. Term 2 for students starts on Tuesday 30th April.

As has been the case with every change to our site area - all evacuation processes will be re-written and the updated drills shared with children on the first day back to school. Because of the recent events, a city wide Ministry of Education, NZ Educational Institute (Union) and Principals' Association review of Lockdown procedures is currently underway. There will be changes to how schools communicate and activate these procedures and as soon as these new procedures are developed they will be communicated with the whole community. This review will likely impact procedures for schools nationwide.

Because there will be no access to our current bike and scooter area, a new lockable compound is being created for Terms 2, 3 and 4. We are aiming to have this in action in Week 10 of this term. It will be located behind the Performance Arts Learning Room and the Music Room. We have decided to set this up this side of the holidays so that any access issues can be managed more easily.

# Off the Shelf - News from the Library

Following on from looking at the Library web app in the last newsletter I'd like to show you a great search - One Search, well worth introducing your children to if they don't use it already.

Head over to the <u>web app</u> and enter the subject you're looking for e.g. trees - this will show you the books available from St Martins Library, but there's more available in just a click or two! Take a look on the left side, you can filter the results by type of book - picture book, non-fiction etc and the tab below gives you the One Search options. Here there are a number of sites listed, both search engines and websites. Simply click on one or more of these and the same search, in this example trees, will repeat and open in a different window - a very quick and simple way to retrieve information without touching the dreaded Google which the students can become very bogged down in! # **Staff Only Day**



## **Calling all unwanted Mobile Phones**






It would be great if you could rummage around in your drawers and toy boxes and bring into school any unwanted mobile phones you may have.
