## Kia ora Whānau - Greetings everyone

It's all go with term end upon us and preparation for the shift into the new building. These are very exciting times, but also quite disrupting. Thank you for your understanding of the office situation. We hope that by the end of Week 1 of the new term the office will be fully functional in its new, temporary location in the new build library. So what will be happening over the school break? The build team is working hard to make sure that everything is finished. Much of the internal fit out is complete, with the carpet almost in place, cupboards and storage installed, lighting and tech systems nearly up and going (apart from the big link up to the main server) and some temporary fittings are being installed in the new library area so that it can be used as an office admin area and staffroom.

Next week all the concrete works will be completed and mid week the tar seal will be laid. The outside areas will be made safe and there will be a full check of all services and facilities to ensure that a final occupancy-compliance can be obtained. All going well the movers will shift all furniture and teacher and class resources into the new building on the Tuesday and Wednesday of the second week of the holidays. It is hoped that this can be completed prior to Anzac Day on Thursday 25th April. There will be a blessing on the morning of 26th April at 9am and following that staff will start unpacking and setting up the new spaces. During this time the fences will be relocated and we can then establish our new environment rules and expectations.

This will include altering the pathway for cyclist and scooter access to the cycle compound.

There will be a Teacher Only Day on Monday 29th April during which staff will finalise set up and where we will finalise our emergency evacuation and lockdown procedures for the school and ensure that the temporary interclass communications systems operate as we hope.

So a great deal has to happen in a very compressed time but we are confident that when children return on Tuesday 30th April we will be up and running at 100%. Enjoy the holiday break with your children and hopefully your children will have a safe

## **School Notices**

### St Martins takes out first 2019 Korfball Tournament - from the Korfball Canterbury page



St Martins has attended most our tournaments over the past three years without even putting their name on the trophy. This time around they entered five teams. With several from the top St Martins team returning from last year, they put up some big scores in the pool games, as did the other main contenders. Semi-finals were much tighter though, with defence dominating and players becoming more nervous.

In the end, the final was won by one goal and the play off for third and fourth by two. Despite conceding only two goals all day, defending champions Christchurch South had to be content with second place this time around.
