Lewis, Mitchell and Liam from the Year 7-8 syndicate were part of the Cashmere Technical U12 team that took part in the Christchurch International Cup, a football tournament held in the school holidays. The team made it all the way to the final unbeaten but unfortunately the Nomads were too good for them - 2nd place out of 16 teams from all over New Zealand is pretty amazing though! On top of that Lewis took out the Golden Boot trophy for being top goal scorer in the U12 tournament!





The EPro8 Challenge competition, is an engineering and problem solving race. Every year over 10,000 students from 900 schools from throughout New Zealand take part. Teams compete to build large sized structures, solve practical problems, engineer using pulleys, motors, gears, wheels and axles, invent machines that can complete simple tasks, undertake unusual and fun experiments, construct basic electronic circuits and solve interesting problems using practical maths. On Monday night "John the Builder" team consisting of Nerhys, Olivier, Hugh and Jack competed against 12 teams and won!

And another EPro8 update! On Wednesday this week four Year 5-6 teams competed and two of our teams made it to the finals. "20 Volts of Power" team consisting of Jamie, Hashim, Elsie and Harvey then went on to take first place! They gained 510 points which was the highest of any Year 5-6 team ever!!! We are very proud of the Year 5-6 and Year 7-8 teams who took out first place and we are also very proud of all of our teams who took part in this amazing competition. You all worked hard and did your best and should be very proud of your achievements.
