Kia ora koutou,

In previous build updates, we've talked about acoustic/noise issues in our new Block A. We had a report done by acoustic engineers Powell Fenwick to try and find out why parts of the building seemed to funnel and in some cases amplify noise from one space to another. Our teachers notice it and so do our children. The Board is working hard to try and fix these issues and the good news is, I've had a personal assurance from the Ministry of Education that they will fund noise dampening solutions. We know some in this building find the noise levels high and are finding it tough. There are things that can be put in place to really bring these levels down and to stop the noise funneling through the spaces. Our teachers have been amazing in coping with this issue and so have the children. I am working hard to try and get this issue fixed as soon as possible so that we can really enjoy this amazing space for teaching and learning. I am in the process of talking to the sound engineers who will tell us which products or building retro-fitting (glass windows or sliding doors) will give us the best outcomes to dampen down the noise. The public health nursing service is a team of registered nurses who can:

- Meet with you at home/school/workplace/cafe to talk about how to manage health problems in a way that suits your family, and work alongside with you, your child and the school. Deliver School Based Vaccination Programmes.
- Attend health appointments with you and your child to support you to ask questions and have your questions answered.
- ▶ Supports teachers to manage your child's health issue during the school day by providing advice and care plans.
- Access further support with your consent, for example for parenting/budgeting/mental health and follow through to make sure that you have the support you want.




