Thank you for the wonderful welcome I received on Monday at the Mihi Whakatau. It was a lovely way to be welcomed back into the school and for Templeton Primary School to share in a new experience. I have had a great first week of getting into classrooms chatting with the children and teachers. It has also been nice to chat to parents at the gate at dropping off and on pick ups. I'm really looking forward to getting to know all of the community and the things we are involved in. Please do come and introduce yourself, perhaps at the Y5 – 8 athletics next week on Wednesday, come and say hi.

This week has been about being visible in the classroom, I have listened to children read, heard wonderful writing, participated in a couple of sprint races and seen fabulous artwork during create, connect and collaborate in Explorers One.

From the sounds of it, the children have had a wonderful two week break and are ready for the last term of the year. I have been really impressed with the way the children have settled into the term, particularly for the children who have changed spaces.

During the holidays we had 16 classes moving learning spaces. No small feat, however this was completed in the last week of the holidays when the refurbished block, Te Maunga was handed back to us. Thank you to Mike and Jenny for overseeing the movement of all of the teachers' resources and class equipment and the teachers for putting their learning spaces together in such a small window of time. The blessing of Te Maunga to name all of the spaces on the last Friday morning was a marvelous way to end the week ready for the children to return. We hope you enjoy talking with your children about the new spaces and come in for a visit to have a wander through.

This term the old junior blocks will be demolished so the work on the new courts can take place, having them ready for the start of school in 2020. Please be aware that the driveway access to Rooms 6, 7, 24 and 25 will be unavailable for weeks 2, 3 and 4 due to the contractors having trucks on site. After this we are hoping to have limited access to the driveway for drop off and pick up times. We were surprised to find the Junior Playground out of action during the holidays. A path is needing to be put in next to the playground. This means either the playground needs to be moved approximately 2m forward or a different path option needs to be investigated. We are hoping to have a resolution and the playground up and running in the next three weeks.

Term four is our time to confirm staffing and start looking at class placements for the following year. Thank you to the parents who took the opportunity to let us know any details required about placement of their child. The form we used for this was open for five weeks and closed off on the last Sunday of the holidays. We will take into consideration the information that you have shared with us. Student Achievements

Hip Hop Competition - This year we entered three teams in the Primary Sports Canterbury Hip Hop competition. The Year 5/6 team placed an impressive 1st place in the Year 5/6 Novice category. Our Year 7 team placed 6th and our Year 8 team placed 8th from 14 teams in the Year 7/8 Novice category. Impressively our Year 7/8 teams mixed their own music and choreographed the dance sequence themselves - an amazing effort! A big thank you to Emily Jones for choreographing and leading our Year 5/6's - your time, expertise and enthusiasm was much appreciated by the crew and parents involved! Special mention also to Sandy Jones for all your hard work behind the scenes.

NZ Secondary Schools Mountain Biking Championships

Year 8 students, Meg Baker and Payo O'Sullivan competed in the Mountain Biking Champs in Dunedin over the school holidays. Both did exceptionally well in their races. Meg placed 2nd in NZ in the U14 Girls Cross Country and Payo also placed 2nd in NZ in the U13 boys Cross Country and 7th in the Enduro. Even more exceptional was the ranking for St Martins School. Of the 108 schools entered, Meg and Payo's efforts saw St Martins ranked 43rd overall.

South Island Football Tournament - In the first week of the school holidays, the Cashmere Technical Football Club 12th Grade girls played in the South Island Tournament in Blenheim. They were 12 minutes away from winning the tournament, but lost 2-1 in the final to a very strong Southland team. The players included Maisy Cowie (captain), Thelma Jolly, Savannah Olsen. Minah van Dam and Lucy Young.

Further to the team's achievements, Minah was voted the team Most Valuable Player and Savannah was golden boot for the tournament with 14 goals! Well done to you all!

Inter-Regional Cross Country Results - At the end of last term Felicity Newsom, Minah van Dam and Hannah Hughes competed in the Inter-Regional Cross Country event in Hanmer Springs. They all put in a lot of hard work at the training sessions over 10 weeks in Term 3. It was a hard course where they had to run through a stream, climb up stairs, navigate a bridge, corners and muddy hills - and it was also a lot of fun! Felicity ran in the Year 5 girls 2km race and placed 26th. Minah ran in the Year 7 girls 3km race and placed 7th. Minah placed in the top 4 for Canterbury and earned a silver team medal. Hannah ran in the Year 8 girls 3km race and placed 25th.

The Canterbury Regional Team won the entire meet by earning the most points overall and won back the Phil Costley Shield. They also won the Team Relay race. Well done to Felicity, Minah and Hannah and to all of the Canterbury competitors.

What can the Public Health Nursing Service offer you and your family?

The public health nursing service is a team of registered nurses who can:

- Meet with you at home/school/workplace/café to talk about how to manage health problems in a way that suits your family, and work alongside with you, your child and the school. Deliver School Based Vaccination Programmes.
- Attend health appointments with you and your child to support you to ask questions and have your questions answered.
- Support teachers to manage your child's health issue during the school day by providing advice and care plans.
- Access further support with your consent, for example for parenting/budgeting/mental health, and follow through to make sure that you have the support that you want.
