## **BOARD UPDATE**

It has been another unprecedented couple of months for our school, but as ever, our staff and community have risen to the challenge. As a Board, we acknowledge the sterling work undertaken by all the staff during the lockdown, especially given the incredibly short transition time from school to home learning. I know for my family, it certainly made life easier having that support and structure in place.

Most of the Board business has been on hold during the lockdown period, however I would like to update the community on the rezoning process. Thank you to the many people who took the time to submit. The submissions have all been carefully considered by the Board committee and have been taken into account as we make our submission to the Ministry of Education. We have decided as a Board, to request that the area currently omitted from the proposed zone which takes in Prossers Rd and Wades Ave, following the river boundary, remain within our zone. This is having considered both the large number of submissions from the community, as well as the new Cashmere High School zone boundaries.

The next step will see our submission go to the Ministry, which is responsible for making the decision on the final zone boundary. In making this decision, the Ministry will take into account factors such as the risk of overcrowding (both at our school and neighbouring schools), the best use of the local school network, and whether students have access to a reasonably convenient school. We anticipate that the amended zone will be implemented during the 2021 school year before the end of the year.

In the meantime, it is great to see so many of our tamariki back and enjoying school. Stay well and horoi ō ringa ringa: keep washing those hands. Ngā mihi,

Always great to catch up with parents and children as you enter the grounds. Lots of positive smiles throughout the week which has been nice to see. Thanks too for the drink bottles and personal hand sanitiser, this has made the transition from activities and breaks to get back into learning as smooth as possible.

This week I would like to thank the Y8 school leaders for the wonderful work they did during the lockdown. Three great videos posted on our Facebook page to keep our spirits lifted, celebrating May 4<sup>th</sup> and Sign Language within NZ.

Sending messages to Junior classes and staff to reassure them they are making a positive difference during this time. You are wonderful role models for us all.













Teachers have adjusted their environments to lessen the contact between children within their spaces through the use of allocated seating and bag areas. We will continue with this next week and then look to implement some greater interaction in the following week with the next announcement from the Government around alert levels.

Our programmes have had a focus on sharing experiences, the learning that has taken place at home, continued relationships and coming back to learning as a group. All classes continue to take their time to create positive experiences with the children while looking back at our time at home and forward to the learning that can take place at school. Mixed in with getting back into core curriculum and our school values there has been lots of Visual Art, games in the sunshine, some building of huts and a sprinkling of cross country training with a variety of running games and distance training – I've had the pleasure to enjoy a gentle jog with a group of Y7 / 8's and the hurley burley of the 500m dash with the New Entrants in Harakeke. We are looking forward to holding a cross country event later in the term.

As we move through Alert Levels we will continue to look at our programmes, in particular what we can offer the children due to the cancellation of a number of activities. We look forward to the Y7 / 8 children returning to technology this week. Transport to and from the Technology centres is provided by the Ministry of Education (MoE), this means the bus companies provided must adhere to the guidelines that the MoE have put in place. We are starting to think about reporting and what this might look like for the remainder of the year, Y5 / 6 camps in September, interschool sport competitions – to name just a few aspects. As we are able to finalise events we would also like to gather community voice around the participation in these. This may be on an ongoing basis as we hear more from providers.

Next week we would like to gather information from our community about their experience during the lockdown. This will be an online survey with the results being used to inform the school and be part of the Greater Christchurch Schools Network (GCSN) data pool. A link will be sent home on Monday next week. We continue to remind children of good hygiene practices at school through covering coughs and sneezes, social distancing (and what this looks like in the playground setting), washing or sanitising hands on the change of activity or coming back inside. We ask that you continue to reinforce these sensible safety measures at home as well. A reminder that unwell children should remain at home. As we heard from Jacinda Ardern last week, "if you have a sniffle or cough, stay home".

Congratulations to Huntsbury for winning term one's House Points. The House Captains will be putting on a sausage sizzle for Huntsbury in the next few weeks.
