

Newsletter 6

It has been great to see all of the Y3 - 8 classes gearing up for the cross country run during the past few weeks. Wonderful to see the varied running, fitness, games based sessions in preparation for our event next week. We invite parents to join us at Hansen Park. However we would prefer that parents were either spread along the course or in the parent spectator area (this will be marked)- following social distancing rules. This week we share the wonderful news that Mrs Caitlin Ross is pregnant. Caitlin, Nick and Grace will be adding to their family in November this year. This is very exciting news, we wish Caitlin and her family all the best, good health and lots of sleep. We are finalising staffing options for nine weeks of term four. At this stage Mrs Lana Sweeney has offered to take on an extra day or two to provide consistency for the children in the last term.

The week before we were asked to stay at home we completed our term one learning conversations. Our approach during the lock down was to do as much (or as little) structured learning that could be managed within your home environment. Because of this different families will have had different learning experiences, all valuable in their own way. As children returned to school the school focussed on making connections, building relationships, the arts and physical movement. As a school we have quietly started to return to our core curriculum directed groupings. However, we are very aware of taking our time and for this reason will not be undertaking any formalised assessment until the end of the term or even the beginning of next term. With this in mind we will be holding Learning Conferences at the end of term two for all children. This 15 minute session will focus on how your child has settled back into learning at school, any aspects from your home learning experience you would like to share or areas for your child to focus on, as well as the progress teachers have seen throughout the term and an aspect of learning that your child will share with you. The learning conference is the mid-year 'general comment'.

So we can provide a space for every family we will be having an early finish. School will close at 1pm on Wednesday 1st July.

In week six of term three we will be sending home your child's mid-year written report. Week six of term three is approximately the half way point between returning to school after lockdown and the end of the year. The term 3 written report will be a slightly shorter report focussing on the three core curriculum areas. We will finish the year with our usual end of year style of report.

This week we are bringing back our first week of hot chocolates. Yesterday the Y8 School Leaders wandered down to Fava - thanks to the School Leaders for the wonderful work they did during the lockdown; connecting with their Junior Classes, writing appreciation letters and the video mashups to bring some 'sunshine' to our days. Tomorrow we will have a group of NE - Y4s and one person from each house who received a playground award join in the hot chocolates. Thank you for the offer of keep cups last term. I think at this stage it would be safer to simply use the takeaway cups provided.
