Dear Parents / Caregivers,

Welcome back to school for another wonderful term of learning. We hope that you have had a chance to have a break with your family during the school holidays. Perhaps a time to reconnect with friends and family, even the opportunity to explore a little further afield.

It was with much sadness that we shared the loss of Lachie Sutherland at the end of last term. Lachie's family held a very moving memorial for Lachie during the holidays. We would like to thank all of the families able to show their support for a young person who will be greatly missed. We were very proud of the children who attended to farewell their friend.

This term we go back to having a Y5 - 8 Kapahaka group. If your child is not in the group and you would like them to join please let your child's teacher know. We are trying to see if we can continue to also have the NE – Y4 children having a session on alternate weeks. As with previous years we may need to focus on the Y5 – 8s for the whole session to be able to be ready for the Chch Cultural Festival in term four.

There are a number of opportunities for parents and caregivers to get involved in our school programme. This may include getting involved: Garden to Table, Winter Sport, Camps, Reading programmes, or assisting with events or trips: Swim week, Art Gallery visits, Cross Country running (thanks to John Newsom for coaching and training the Y5 – 8 Canterbury Cross Country team). Everyone is more than welcome to join us for our fortnightly assemblies throughout the term. Our focus is on Matariki next week, further information below. Later in the term a number of teams will be holding Celebration of Learning events for parents to come in and see learning in action. We hope to see you in and around the school when you can.

We have moved to a new Student Management System called Hero. We use this to do a number of in house things like taking the roll, daily notices, collect assessment, pastoral care, behaviour information etc. We are also able to use this as our communication portal with parents. In the next few weeks we will be sending home information for parents to be able to set up their Hero accounts to receive notifications and emails.


At our Board meeting this week we discussed behaviours around noncompliance with learning, the impact of learning being interrupted and safety within our environment. The Board has agreed that it is important that we provide an environment for learning where we are all safe. If your child is disturbing the learning of others or physically threatening another person or is non-compliant for a period of 45 minutes with no change in behaviour then the expectation is that parents will be called to inform them that their child is not ready for learning for the day and will be asked to collect their child. If a child leaves the school grounds, parents will be called immediately to support the school in this safety issue.

Last term after lock down we changed our starting bell to 8.55am. This term we go back to having an 8.50am bell, this indicates to children that it is time to get ready for the school day, followed by an 8.55am bell indicating that









learning will be starting. A reminder that we would prefer children are not on site before 8.30am unless they are with the Homework Club.

STAFFING

Congratulations to Miss Alice Denley and Mr Hamish Lancaster-Whillis on their recent appointments to permanent positions in the leadership team at St Martins School. Alice is one of two Deputy Principals, leading the Y5-8 syndicate as well as assessment and reporting. Hamish is one of four Team Leaders, leading the Y5/6 team. Alice and Hamish have made a real difference in their leadership roles and we look forward to their continued positive contributions.

PROPERTY UPDATE

We are pleased to be using the hoops on the top courts this term. We believe we will reap the benefits of the investment of \$18,000 in hoops for both the school and the community. We have eight basketball hoops and four netball hoops as well as six moveable netball hoops. Enough for lots of games to be going at one time. It's great to see all of these being in use in some way, during school hours and after school. Thanks once again to the Student Council and The Smart Community for buying the two basketball towers. Our new safety fence has been installed around the front entrance. The Whanau Group have finalised a gate which is in keeping with the waharoa. The design will allow us to continue to fully open the entrance way before and after school, while children are in class we will close the gates, leaving a single access gate to be opened. The gate will be completed and installed as soon as possible. The Board of Trustees is discussing the front entrance way, thinking about a design that will continue to enhance and soften the front of the school. The school and Ministry of Education (MoE) continue to negotiate the placement of any further gates.

This week we were informed that the school has been given the go ahead to start planning for two new classrooms to be built. We are able to build these rooms due to increased in zone roll growth. The Board of Trustees and the MoE will begin the process of identifying a suitable area for these rooms to be built (this will probably mean that we will need to demolish some rooms to make a space).

MATARIKI

All of our class programmes have had a focus on Matariki during the past two weeks of learning. If you are in the classroom perhaps ask your child to show you some of the art work, reading, writing or research. Next week we will be having an assembly that focusses on Matariki. The NE – Y4 children will be sharing their learning from Kapahaka to perform as well as having some written pieces from each class. As usual we will be having split assemblies for this. We will have;


