SCHOOL UPDATE

Thanks for your quick response and support when we moved to Alert L2. Great to see children being dropped off at the gate or if needed parents using the tracer app displayed on the doors or signing into the paper copies in the rooms. As a teaching staff we discussed what our response would be in a short-term Alert L3 scenario. We have identified teachers who would be the first to be available to continue teaching children of essential workers onsite, other teachers were nominated to make hard packs of activities that parents could pick up from the school in different locations so it remained contactless. In the next few weeks we will be checking on parent details and how many children we need to cater for if we moved to this higher alert level. We will also get an indication from families if they would like a short-term paper pack of activities or if they are happy simply to have their children at home and will create their own experiences. We will be sending home a paper copy of current contact details which we would like you to check and send back. You may have noticed some running starting at 8.45am with the Y7 / 8s doing one, two or three laps of the stairs track as we head into the cross country season. With the warm weather we are having a before school run which seems to be an ideal time to start. We have the Y5 – 8 cross country in week 11 of this term, never too early to start training. Maybe a whole family walk or jog on a balmy evening (you could even join us in the mornings for a run). The Y5 / 6 children run 2km and the Y7/8's 3km. As well as running the stairs lap, the teachers have games that involve running as part of their weekly programme.

This year as a teaching staff we are learning more about structured literacy and how this could enhance our reading programme. We have been very fortunate to work with Caroline Moritt, our Resource Teacher of Literacy, to lead us in discussion and for some of us to be able to observe her working with children. This year will be ideal to learn more, engage in conversations, purchase new resources and for some staff to look at different practice at other schools that have started their journey.

Thanks to those parents who attended the Meet the Teacher evening last night. It was nice to see lots of parents in the school.

We go back to celebrating learning in our assemblies this year. On Friday 12th March we look forward to Discoverers 2 sharing their learning with us. We hope you can come along for a 2.15pm start. Each pod will have a turn sharing this year, I'm sure classroom teachers will let you know when this is happening.

A reminder that children need to walk their bikes and scooters up and down the drive, through the school to the playground depending on the entry and exit point they are using.

PROPERTY UPDATE

We are getting closer and closer to starting our hall extension. The focus will be on upgrading the standard of the hall to be able to fit us all in. An extra bay will be added, toilets, paint and floors upgraded. The old stage will be dropped with a new moveable stage being utilised. It is likely that this work will start early term two, which means we will not be able to use the hall for most of term two.

The Lachie Memorial Garden plans are coming along with an aim for planting in July.

The BoT is currently looking at plans to create a flexible learning space similar to those at the bottom of the two storey block and Rooms 11 / 12. Once our plans are finalized the work may start as early as June. The current music room, resource room and two unused classrooms on the far side of the school will be demolished and the two new roll growth classrooms will be built in this area.

of children aged 4-12 years

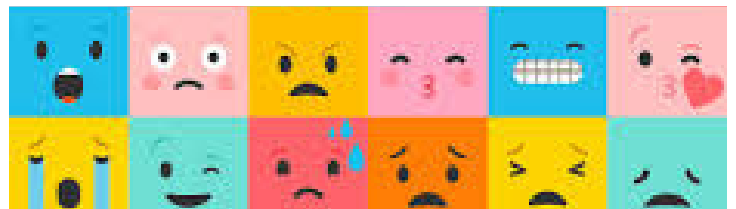
Tuning in to Kids is an evidence-based programme designed to teach parents & caregivers:

- awareness and regulation of their own emotions;
- awareness of their children's emotions;
- to use children's emotional experiences as an opportunity for closeness and teaching;
- skills in assisting children to verbally label and manage their emotions;
- skills in assisting children to problem solve;
- to guide children's behaviour with appropriate limits.

Sessions include:

- watching video material
- group discussions and exercises
- role plays
- home activities to practice different ways of responding to your child's emotions

Parents are encouraged to share experiences and ideas within the group.
