SCHOOL UPDATE

The Y7 / 8 children have had another wonderful sailing experience (with Rms 19 and 20 looking to reschedule their day). This has tied in to their Inquiry Topic based on Wind. The children were able to put into practice the St Martins values revising and putting into practice new learning, taking responsibility as a group to care and encourage each other. It was wonderful to see children that may have been tentative around the boats in the morning utilising the increase in the wind or even having a go at controlled capsizing. Thank you to all of the parents able to support the five classes on the trip.

Last week we had a refresher session for the children new to the road patrol. Constable Meg supported the children to refine their skills down on the Centaurus Rd crossing. Before we went out onto the street we had a conversation about what our community is doing well and areas we can continue to work on. A number of positives included the majority of families / children waiting for the 'Cross Now' call before crossing the road. Families / children standing back behind the sign to allow the road patrollers to see the traffic. The areas we can continue to work on include walking bikes and scooters across the crossing and in particular on Centaurus Rd crossing with the road patrol rather than at the roundabout.

A couple of reminders around timeframes. We prefer children arrive at school after the 8.30am bell. This means the classrooms are open and we have staff members in the rooms to meet and greet the children. If your child is at school before 8.30am they need to wait either outside Rooms 21 - 24 or in front of the Whare Kūkūwai. As usual if your child has a phone they need to keep this in their bag until the 8.30am bell goes and then hand it in at the office for the day. We have had a few incidences at the end of the school day recently and ask that

the children leave the school grounds and go home, coming back if they are able to. If children are using the school grounds remember that there will be teachers continuing to work or be in meetings and they will need to be respectful of them.
