BOARD UPDATE

Last Sunday afternoon, with the weather gods smiling upon us, we had another great turnout for our planting bee in Lachie's "bee-friendly" garden. The combination of year 7/8 William Pike students, returning year 9 friends of Lachie (and parents too) made short work of the task -and the subsequent afternoon tea! Many thanks to our gardener Phillipa Curtis for organising plants, materials and clearing up at the end and also to Katie Chilton and Elle Fairgrey from Boffa Miskel who designed and planned the planting, then laid everything out ready to go. We also got to try out the new seats, donated by the local Men's Shed and being installed by our wonderful landscaper Dave McLaren of Spaceman gardens. Just a few last finishing touches and it's not far off being ready... Great team work all round!

As a school we are working with the Council on a new School Travel Plan. The school has taken part in this project before and it is timely to have a refresh. The Council has informed us that they have received ongoing complaints about parking behaviour in the area around St Martins School. The Parking Compliance Team have been actively monitoring this area over the last month during school peaks. Staff advise that they have been there on multiple occasions and issued 24 tickets for parking on broken yellow lines, parking in the No Stopping area, and overstaying the P3.

Congratulations to all of the children playing in the Y5 - 8 Korfbal competition yesterday. Great to see so many children participating. Some results from yesterday included two 2nds and a 3rd place. There was a positive vibe amongst all of the players representing St Martins School. Thank you to the teachers for your support of the children throughout the tournament.

We are very excited to have a schoolwide Celebration of Learning next Tuesday 1.30 - 2.30pm. All classes will be open to families to come and see the fabulous learning the children have been involved in around Matariki. Across the school we have stories, art work, songs and digital objects to share. You may want to visit your own child's class and then pop through some of the others. We hope to see you in the afternoon. To start the week the children in Y3 / 4 have invited parents to come and see their Kapahaka performance on Monday 1.30 - 2.00pm. This is a culmination of the learning they have undertaken during term two with Tania and Willy. The performance will be in the hall.

Written reports will be sent home on Monday with the children. You will notice that there is not a general comment box on the report. This is because we will be following the reports up with a face to face learning



conference on Wednesday and Thursday. PROPERTY UPDATE

Well, no action on the hall as we had hoped. However we will now have a flurry of planned activities on property projects starting in the holidays. The hall project will have builders onsite cordoning off and setting up to start the project. This will be completed while there are no children or staff on site and is carefully managed.

The new two classroom block to be built on the North West side of the school will begin with the cladding being taken off the four classrooms. The area surrounding what is currently the Teacher Resource Room, Music Room and two empty rooms will be cordoned off through the holidays with demolition of these starting. With both projects there is asbestos cladding to be removed. This will be done during the holiday period following the Ministry of Education Guidelines. The asbestos removal work will be undertaken by a licensed asbestos removal company. WorkSafe NZ will be notified of the work. An asbestos removal control plan (ARCP) has been developed (and is on site) to ensure that adequate measures are in place to minimise risk and to meet regulatory requirements. During these works, access to the immediate surroundings will be restricted. Signs and barricades will be in place to delineate the asbestos work area, it is a legal requirement for an appropriate exclusion zone to remain in place during the asbestos removal works in the event of an unforeseen event. Immediate neighbours will be notified of a more concise timeframe when it has been finalised.

Thank you for your patience with this work. It seems to have been a long time coming. We will be very tight for space in the coming term, we will be sharing some spaces and wherever possible adapting programmes to have them continuing.
