

As you may have noticed the work on the hall and the classrooms down the side of the school is underway. The asbestos cladding needing removal was taken out during the school holidays. The work on the hall has continued with foundations for the new bay being poured either this week or next.

The MoE will be demolishing four classrooms and building two new flexible spaces, similar in style to Rooms 20-24. This work has a best case scenario of being completed by the beginning of term one 2022. With this building work happening we have a number of spaces that we are unable to use. - skills in assisting children to problem solve;
- to guide children's behaviour with appropriate limits.

- watching video material
- · group discussions and exercises
- · role plays
- home activities to practice different ways of responding to your child's emotions

Parents are encouraged to share experiences and ideas within the group.


