SCHOOL UPDATE

Kia ora e te Whānau,

This week we welcome Immy to the senior school, and Julian and Olivia to the junior school. We look forward to sharing in your positive learning journey at St Martins School.

Welcome back to school. We hope that you all had a positive lockdown experience. Thank you for engaging with the learning at home, whether it was online learning or hard pack learning. This year we worked hard at using one main communication source, HERO and this may have been followed up with a second information source (eg Facebook, School Website, Seesaw, Dojo). If you did not receive any communication from the school or classroom teacher's during lockdown please let Alice Denley (aliced@stmartins.school.nz) know so we can update your HERO details.

It was great to pop into some Google Meets throughout the lockdown period. Thank you for taking the time to have your children meet with their classmates and teachers.

We continue to be in Alert L2 until Tuesday 21st September. At Alert Level 2 we continue to ask that parents drop their children off at the gate and do not come onsite if possible. If you do come into the school grounds please use the contact tracer QR code to track that you have been at St Martins School. If you go into the classroom please make sure you fill in the paper contact sheet. This simply means if we needed to trace who had been in a certain space it would be a smaller group than who had been in the school grounds. As usual, if your child is unwell please keep them home.

For the first few days of all being back at school we had the children learning in their home rooms in allocated desks. This helped to reduce the movement

through the school as we settled back in. We continued to remind children to sanitise when going outside, coming back into class and before eating. Face coverings / masks have been used. This week we have gone back to some of our collaborative across home room practices.

You may have noticed that we are able to continue to have whānau at school to support learning. During these times the person supporting the learning is counted as part of our bubble. If we had whānau spectating at an event (eg sports, mihi competition) then we would have to meet the L2 requirements of 50 inside and 100 outside.

The Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health have both indicated that Education Outside the Classroom events are able to continue as long as the provider is able to meet the L2 requirements. Alice Denley has attended the EONZ seminar on good practice during L2 for EOTC events. We seek clarification from the providers whether the trip can go ahead or the changes they have made to the event to meet the L2 guidelines. If we are satisfied at school we will continue with the trip, if







we are not, the trip will not go ahead. We know that Navigators 2 will have a wonderful camp experience this week in Hanmer, it was a beautiful spring morning to be setting off yesterday.

Staffing Update

We congratulate Michele Stephens on gaining an administration position at Rangi Ruru. We thank Michele for the 16 years of wonderful work she has put into St Martins School. We have greatly appreciated her time as a Teacher Aide in the classroom before moving into the office admin area taking on student accounts, payroll, Principal's PA and Admin Team Leader. The responsibilities and tasks undertaken by Michele have been shared across the admin team of Kate, Megan and Diane for the remainder of the year.

2022 Class Placements

As we come into term four we start discussing the make-up of classes for the following year. This term we are starting the preparations for 2022 class organisation. As we have previously mentioned the Ministry of Education would like to see the roll reduce at St Martins School. In 2022 we will see some teams reduce from five teachers to four teachers. This means that we will again move away from the two year cycle with the majority of children moving classes. We do believe we have wonderful teachers across our school and to have an experience with eight teachers rather than four has benefits in itself. Class placements involve a number of discussions to enable us to make the best decisions for each student. We take into consideration a number of factors, sitting together on numerous occasions to discuss the make-up of groupings. At St Martins School we have mixed ability classes, we use the following definition for placing children: groups of children working at similar levels - with consideration of ages, social, behavioural and emotional aspects.

As with previous years we extend an invitation for you, as parents, to make us aware of any information that might be relevant to the placement of your child children. This is an opportunity to give us information that will help us with our process, it is not an invitation to select your child's 2022 teacher.
