2022 Class Placements

In our last newsletter we offered the opportunity for parents to let us know any aspects that may need to be considered for the placement of their child / children. At St Martins School we have mixed ability classes, we use the following definition for placing children: groups of children working at











similar levels - with consideration of ages, social, behavioural and emotional aspects. Our processes around class placements are robust.

- Your child's teacher starts by grouping children.
- Teams of teachers come together to discuss the groupings and place them in next year's class.
- Teachers meet across teams to discuss placement of children.
- Team leaders look at groupings, have follow up conversations with teachers as needed.
- The Senior Leadership Team looks at the overview and goes back to Team Leaders / Teams as needed.

This process takes the majority of the term, six or seven weeks. As always, the children's best interests are placed in the very centre of these conversations. Information shared from parents that nominates a teacher for their child will be set aside as this is not an opportunity for parents to select their child's teacher for 2022

PROPERTY UPDATE

The Friendship Garden will be having a concrete path poured during the holiday break with an opening early in the new term.

SMART TOUCH 2021

Registrations for term 4 opened on September 20th, so it's time to be getting teams, coaches and managers together. You don't need any prior experience to coach touch. Touch Canterbury facilitate coaching workshops for those interested. Information on how the game is played is under the tab: **Competition Rules** on www.sporty.co.nz/smarttouch. Website will be operational from September 19th 2022. Steps to register:

- 1. Fill out the google doc sent from school. Indicate if you are an individual or you are in a formed team, please state team name and coach or manager.
- 2. Someone from Smart touch will be in touch if you are an individual and you will be placed into a team. Be aware there needs to be parents to coach and manage for this to happen.
- 3. Appoint a team manager and coach.
- 4. Team manager/Coach enters online using the URL address www.sporty.co.nz/smarttouch
- 5. On the Smart touch home page fill out the touch team manager sign up form and submit it. This means you are registered in the module. Please do this ASAP, as teams have missed out in the past due to not organising a manager quickly enough.
- 6. You will then receive an email giving you the link to enter your player details. To complete this it is helpful to have all your teams full names, Date of birth and contact phone number and email on hand.

New Touch NZ Policy

Changes that were implemented last season. A basic summary of these are:

Year 0-4: No score keeping, modified rules, 5 players on the field, open ratio (any ratio of boys and girls), half field, max of 10 in a team. 8 ideal

Year 5/6: scoring, but not recorded, standard rules, 5 players on the field, mixed ratio 2:3, half field, max of 10 in a team. 8 ideal

Year7/8: Scoring and recorded, standard rules, 6 players, mixed 3: 3, full field.

A full outline of the new policy is on our website under Rules.

We are all looking forward to a great season.


