Covid Updates

We continue to adjust to the new guidelines put in place by the Ministry of Health and Ministry Of Education. From last term we continue to focus on providing air flow in all learning spaces. This involves ensuring that windows and doors are open whenever possible and at a minimum during break times. Thank you to the parents who have picked up the new change to being onsite, face coverings are now a requirement for parents coming onsite. A reminder of the new MoE guidelines for drop off and pick up;

- These should occur in an outdoor environment where face coverings must be worn, and physical distancing measures retained.
- Parents, whānau and caregivers are not required to be vaccinated or tested in order to pick up or drop off children.

Face coverings are required to be worn by students aged 12 and over while on any school transport service under all alert levels. Could families please provide children with a face mask for Friday's technology transport.

The mandate for those working in education to be vaccinated includes parents who are working with children, from 1 Jan 2022 this would include parent helps on camp etc. At this stage we are waiting from further information around this.

2022 Class Placements

During the holidays Teachers started grouping children for placement, this week children will be asked to nominate three children they learn well with in the classroom setting. We aim to have at least one of these nominations in the home room or across the pod.

We have provided the last six weeks as an opportunity for parents to provide further information to be considered about the placement of their child. The survey closes tomorrow, Friday 22nd October at 4pm https://forms.gle/V35DeRfN4ePjuBvo6. Information shared from parents that nominates a teacher for their child will be set aside as this is not an opportunity for parents to select their child's teacher for 2022.

PROPERTY UPDATE

The extension of the hall continues to progress. With the hall being enclosed the next phase will see the team moving to complete the new bathroom configurations, flooring, interior and exterior painting. The new timeline is for the hall to be completed around the 11th of Nov with a week or two after that for the Council to sign off completion.

The Friendship Garden is in the last throws of completion with a finalised opening date of October 30. Thank you to everyone involved in getting this space ready for the children to use. We look forward to this space being open and offering the students a unique space to meet, relax and learn in.

Our last build program of demolishing four classrooms and building two new rooms is still waiting at the consenting phase. The builders are ready and waiting to get the green light to start demolishing the rooms. What feels like an ever hopeful timeframe would be the start in November.
