





CLASS PLACEMENTS

COVID UPDATES

As you may be aware the motu (country) moves to the CPF/Traffic Light system on Friday 3rd December (tomorrow). Christchurch will be at the Orange Level. The Ministry of Education has shared in their bulletin to schools on 13 October and 29 November 2021, the following:





And as the MoE would ask, *does your school want to be the super spreader?*

This means that although the motu is working in the traffic light system, our school will continue meeting the requirements of the existing Level 2 settings. This year and next, health, safety and wellbeing will continue to be a priority for us and the same public health measures you are very familiar with will remain in place:

- good hygiene and cleaning
- contact tracing systems in place
- vaccination requirements for workers (paid and unpaid)
- if you are sick, you must stay home and get tested
- good ventilation.

As we come into the end of the year we start discussing graduations and assemblies. We have gone back and confirmed with our Ministry of Education advisor the parameters around these. This year we need to consider how these will work within the gatherings rule if we are to invite parents. First and foremost we are working to make sure there is some type of final aspect for all students. With all of our teams having more than 100 students it makes it impossible to also invite whānau to team assemblies or bigger. Teams will be finalising how Christmas performances and final assemblies will look with information about these going home at the beginning of next week. We are looking into live streaming or recording of events just as other local schools are. Our Y8 graduation planning will remain the same with the Hillview site being able to offer two distinct areas, one for the students and staff and one for a family member to attend to view.

For next year, we can confirm that everyone will be back onsite for learning from the start of the school year, regardless of what setting under the new Traffic Light Framework we will be in. This is good news and means we can plan for a great 2022.











And if we are at Red at any stage next year:

- face coverings will be required at school when indoors for students and staff in years 4-13
- we will ask that only essential visitors come onsite.

With all these measures in place, public health has confirmed the risk of infection remains low when at school, with households continuing to be where COVID-19 is spreading the most.

However, if we do have someone confirmed with COVID-19 in our school, we have a plan in place to manage this and will contact you as soon as possible.

PROPERTY UPDATE


