This may be face to face or online depending on the requirements at the time. We have continued with our sports experiences with the Y3 / 4s having cricket sessions and the Y7 / 8s having korfball training. Lots of outside learning and mask breaks continue to happen on a regular basis.

The numbers will be lower than the allocated one hundred, the children will not mix with the public having our own entry and exit doors as well as an allocated changing time. We ask that children competing arrive in their swimming gear so that they do not need to use the changing rooms at the beginning of the session.

COVID UPDATE

Thank you for keeping your children at home if they are unwell. We continue to ensure our classrooms are ventilated with windows and doors open for as long as possible. We have been given a CO2 monitor by the MoE and have placed this in each class for two rounds and have results that show each class sits well within the expected level for classroom learning. As you will be aware this is quite a fluid moving situation at the moment. There are changes happening on a regular basis. New information from the MoE that if a child is a confirmed class and has been in a classroom, if they have been wearing a mask and the other children have been wearing a mask then the child who tested positive will need to stay home for the recommended isolation period, however, the other children in the class will be classified as casual contacts and can continue to attend school.

If you are able to, could you please send an extra mask to school in your child's bag, currently we are giving out around 125 per week.

Today the Government announced that we will move into phase three as of tonight. This again may mean changes in the education sector. As we know more we will keep you updated.
