SCHOOL UPDATE

Thank you to the student council for running the sports themed mufti day this week. The children have raised \$386 for Ignite Sport.

Thanks to everyone participating.

There continues to be a flow in and out of the school at the moment. Our current student numbers are 52 tested positive, 40 household contacts and 53 returned to school. We have three staff members away either testing positive or household contacts. This week we changed our approach slightly with combining classes. This is only taken into consideration when the class numbers are low enough to do so or we are unable to find a reliever for the time period. Rooms 16, 19 and 20 have shared children from Rm 19 across the two rooms with Tamara Saxon and either Julie Young or Sarah Williams, Wednesday - Friday.

Due to the fluctuations in the number of children at school and possibly adult helpers we have decided to postpone the term one Y7 / 8 camp. We have a date in term four that we look forward to utilising.











During this time it is important that we continue to have up to date contact details of parents. If your email, home phone, cell phone or address has changed could you please contact Diane in the office (office@stmartins.school.nz)

At the end of term one we usually finish with face to face learning conversations. These focus on how children have settled into their learning and developing class relationships. We are currently discussing the timing of these and the format. We hope to have this finalised so we can update you next week. If your child has settled in well and have no questions regarding learning or behaviour you may want to consider holding off until the term two learning conference.

Thank you for continuing to update us when your child is unwell. If your child is a household contact and then test positive could you please let the school know their new day 0 so we can anticipate the day of their return.

The Ministry of Health has provided further clarity on when household contacts should isolate.

For households where someone has COVID-19, the Ministry of Health recommends you apply the following auidance.

- If someone becomes a confirmed COVID-19 case, then that case and all other people in their household must isolate for seven days.
- If **someone else** in the household then tests positive for COVID-19 during those seven days:
 - the isolation period for that person only re-sets – that person must isolate for an additional seven days from the day they test positive or symptoms begin
 - other household contacts who do not test positive are still able to leave isolation after the original case has completed their seven days isolation.
- For the next 10 days after a household completes seven days isolation, evidence shows that due to their exposure to COVID-19 they are less likely to catch or transmit the virus. This means:
 - if someone else in the household tests positive within those 10 days, the whole household will not have to re-isolate, only the positive case
 - if someone else in the household tests positive and it has been more than 10 days since the household completed isolation, household contacts should re-isolate along with the new case for seven days.
- Any person who has had COVID-19 within the last 90 days/three months will
 not need to isolate as a household contact unless they become
 symptomatic and test positive again. This is because reinfection rates for
 people who have had COVID-19 are low for the three months after they have
 the virus.

Remember, Day 0 for isolation is the day symptoms began or the day the positive test was taken (whichever came first). You should then count your seven days from there.











With the news yesterday we will be able to go back to having team assemblies in the hall with the indoor number now being doubled as well as opening up our playground to be an area for everyone to move around in rather than our four current areas.

We also have an after school care Programme that operates during the term time from 3-6pm.


