Next week we go back to having assemblies. At this stage we will continue with a split school system even though we can all fit in the hall. We look forward to families joining us once again with tamariki receiving values awards. We will also be sharing house points from the playground. We have new times for our Friday assembly focussed around the drop off and pick up times.

As we have previously shared, the Ministry of Education asks all schools to undertake their own risk assessment with the numbers and health aspects in the school.

Currently we have 2% of the school away due to covid, this includes positive cases and household contacts. With the low numbers and after consultation with the Y5 - 8 teachers we will move to masks being recommended in Y5 - 8 classes, however, not compulsory. We will continue to ask Y5 - 8 tamariki to have a mask at school for large group situations (e.g. assembly).

We welcome whānau back on site next week. If you are coming onto the school grounds and remain outside the classroom you will not need to wear a mask. If you do enter the classroom at this stage we will ask that you wear a mask.

Talking with teachers and parents at the gate we have seen an increase in independence particularly in the Junior School as children self manage putting their bags away and getting ready for the day. We have been very impressed with the care that siblings are taking to support their younger brother or sister to get into their room. Perhaps this could continue and there is a greater focus on coming onsite at the end of the day to visit the classroom to see the new learning that has taken place.

PROPERTY UPDATE

We are looking forward to getting back into the hall next week. The floors look great after being sanded and polished during the break, we have basketball, netball and korfball lines all ready to put into use. We will add blinds in the next few weeks as well as finally pulling out the staging purchased by the S'MART COMMUNITY that has been in storage for the past year. The steps to the top courts have been removed so they can be widened. This means that we are only using the driveway for access. This should be completed by the middle of the term.

Hi I'm Rena Oliphant (ex pupil) and I am an aerial performer with over 5 years of experience.

Aerial circus is a form of dance/acrobatics that involves apparatus that is suspended in the air. Examples are the trapeze, lyra (hoop), and silks (pictured above in the silhouette).

I am running aerial circus classes for school aged students, (ages 5-13) We work on beginner skills that develop flexibility, strength and creativity. There are a few options for classes:
