Welcome to the last newsletter for Term 4!

St Martins School is an accredited sunsmart school and in line with this and our School Sun Protection Policy, all students are required to wear their school hats while outside within school hours or at school events during Terms 1 and 4. The Cancer Society advises that sun protection is needed at a UVI level of 3 or higher. This commonly occurs in terms 1 and 4 even on cloudy or cool days. The level may also exceed 3 at other times.

In term 4 sunscreen will be available in classrooms and at the school office, however we also encourage families to apply sunscreen to their children before coming to school and where possible carry their own sunscreen in their school bags.

SmartTouch 2022

Registrations for term 4 are open now, Closing date for entries is 18th October. You don't need any prior experience to coach touch, Touch Canterbury facilitates coaching workshops for those interested.

This is the 11th year that Smarttouch has been organised through St Martins PTA. It is run as a Touch Canterbury Module and was started after the 2011 earthquakes to get kids back into sport and for the community to reconnect. It's a great fundraiser with other local schools entering teams into the competition too. It runs down at Waltham Park on a Thursday night in term 4, starting in week 2 (27th October) for 6 weeks.

Steps to register:

Entering again from last year:

- Your team coach/manager should enter your team online at <u>www.sporty.co.nz/smarttouch</u>
- Enter your team players information 7 team name (DOB, full name, email address and phone number for each player)

<u>Entering for the first time:</u> If you would like to play and are not already in a team our SmartTouch team will help liaise with these teams once registered.

- Sign-up sheets can be found in the classes.
- Each team needs a parent coach and manager to register.
- Visit the link <u>www.sportu.co.nz/smarttouch</u> and complete the **team manager sign up form**. Please do this ASAP, as teams have missed out in the past due to not organising a manager quickly enough.
- You will then receive an email giving you the link to enter your player details. (DOB, full name, email address and phone number)

Touch NZ Policy Changes implemented in 2020

- 8 is an ideal number of players. A basic summary of these are:
- **Y0-4:** No score keeping, modified rules, 5 players on the field, open ratio (any ratio of boys and girls), half field, max of 10 in a team.
- Y5/6: scoring, but not recorded, standard rules, 5 players on the field, mixed ratio 2:3, half field, max of 10 in a team. Minimum of 2 girls on the field.
- Y7/8: Scoring and recorded, standard rules, 6 players, mixed 3: 3, full field.
