### Kia ora koutou,

We welcome Ella to St Martins | Hato Mātene. We hope that Ella and her whānau enjoy the experiences our school has to offer. We look forward to seeing you joining in.

It's great to see the sunshine back today and everyone outside. The change in weather this week saw a change in play, we were impressed with the support the senior children gave with organising indoor games, reading books and getting involved in play with the junior classes while inside during our rainy days. Today all of the tamariki joined in with the Mana presentation by Bernard Mana. The interactive presentation took the children on a journey through Polynesia featuring the Pueblo Indian hoop dance, an explanation of Maori moko, demonstrations of haka and poi, before moving onto aspects from Samoa and Hawaii.

We continue with our EOTC events. We have had trips to support learning as well as sports events this term. A number of today's photos are from the Y3 / 4 Waitaha Wai trip on Monday. Thanks to the CCC for providing the tutors to support our ākonga | learners to check the health of our local river. The Y7 / 8 Boyle River camp is next term. Nicky Pateman has sent home the information in the <u>Google Form</u>. Please have a read of the front page. Children are able to opt into either the adventure based or extreme programmes. Schools are finding the cost of camps is continuing to rise. The Y7 / 8 camp has an approximate cost of \$400 per child. Thank you to the Board for capping the cost to whānau at **\$250 per child**. We will be trying to access funding, some in school fundraising initiatives next term with the Board agreeing to pay any shortfall. To support us to cover the cost of camp we would ask that all children participating have their camp cost paid by Monday 5th June. We are more than happy to support families to set up weekly or fortnightly payments, please contact Megan in the office - <u>meganm@stmartins.school.nz</u>

Now that the building work is finished we are turning our attention to the playground environment. Our starting point is to add more games and activities to our sealed areas. We hope to include 4-square, hopscotch, fitness / sensory trails, chess board, snakes and ladders, wall targets. Our first option will be to try to get some outside funding for these.
