Thank you to the whānau group members who spent time at home making fried bread for our tamariki to try. A special highlight was adding this with the shared soup for the children in the Discoverers on Thursday last week.

This week we farewell Mrs Alice Robins. Alice has been teaching at St Martins | Hato Mātene for the past 8 years. Alice has taught across the school from New Entrants, Y5/6 and finishing in the Y7/8 area. We have enjoyed all of the aspects Alice has brought to our school to enhance teaching and learning. Alice is moving to Nelson to be closer to her family. We congratulate Alice on gaining a teaching position in Nelson starting term three. We welcome Ben Irvine back to the Y7 / 8 team. Ben has previously taught in the High Fliers as well as the Y5 / 6 team last year. Ben is a known regular reliever in the Y7 / 8 area and has built positive relationships across the team. We look forward to Ben joining Rm 12 | Kāpuka from the beginning of term three.

Next term we'll be starting another roll growth class as the New Entrant area continues to grow. We welcome Jemimah O'Leary to the Explorers Team. Jemimah has regularly relieved across the school throughout 2023 and 2024. We look forward to Jemimah sharing her New Entrant expertise with us.

As you may be aware, the Ministry of Education and the teachers union (NZEI) negotiated last year to increase the classroom release time for all teachers. In term three all teachers will be released for at least half a day most weeks, with team leaders and a handful of teachers having release one day a week. We have worked hard to ensure there is as much consistency as possible within the school utilising a number of known relievers as release teachers.

Congratulations to the Showquest team and the tamariki competing in the Speaking for the Planet events last week. Fantastic to see lots of talented children on the stage last week. We welcome new student, Seebe who has joined our Navigators space at St Martins | Hato Mātene, we hope you enjoy your experiences at our school, we look forward to sharing in your learning journey.











Next term we will be trialling a new timetable. This is based on recent research to provide more frequent movement breaks for children to get outside, move about and socialise. We have observed teachers using our current mini break as a time to get outside and break up the first two hour block. Our trial timetable will have a greater number of shorter breaks throughout the day. All children will have a number of break times they can use to refuel. There is some slight variation in the school with the Explorers Team opting to have children sitting down to eat during the first two breaks while we go back to tamariki eating on the go. Our lunch break is shorter with a designated eating time at the end before returning to class. Our timetable for term three will be:

- 8.30am Children able to enter classrooms
- 8.50am 5 minutes before learning starts
- 8.55am Learning session one
- 9.55am Grab and go break
- 10.15am Learning Session two
- 11.15am Grab and go break
- 11.35am Learning Session three
- 12.30pm Lunch break play then eat
- 1.05pm Learning session four
- 2.00pm Little play
 - We may come up with a better name for this, however, at the moment it is quite nostalgic or retro
- 2.10pm Learning Session five
- 3.00pm School finishes

As always, with anything new, there will be trade offs, we have discussed some, I'm sure we will find a few more as we give this a go. We ask our ākinga to have a growth mindset, so as adults we go into this with a positive approach.

Thanks everyone for a great term of learning, the staff for their time at the conferences and developing engaging learning opportunities, the tamariki for your positive approach to your learning and whānau for your ongoing support. Have a wonderful holiday break, stay warm during the wintery weeks ahead, have a happy holiday. We look forward to seeing you return in term three.


