Thanks to the PTA and student leaders, working together to provide a fabulous event for our tamariki. Thanks to James for the banging tunes and AC lighting for creating the disco atmosphere in the hall. As always it's really nice to see so many parents involved in the Junior disco with our youngest tamariki. We appreciate all parents being available to collect their children from the hall so we can ensure the safety of everyone having an adult to get them home.

Tamariki are enjoying the opportunity to join a couple of new lunchtime clubs this term. We have knitting and chess as new options for children this term. Thanks to Miss Kate Keenan and Mr Oscar Adams for leading these initiatives.

Next week we will be running the Y5 - 8 Duathlon. This event has had to be brought forward due to Hansen Park being unavailable at the usual time we would hold this race. Children are able to compete in individual and team events. Fingers crossed for similar crisp, sunny conditions we have had in the past few years. We encourage all ākonga in the Y5 - 8 area to get involved.

With the Canterbury Museum currently closed, we are fortunate that they have mobile classes visiting schools. This term the Navigators and Explorers have utilised this service with children really enjoying their hands-on learning.

Next week we look forward to some of the students from Monster Music sharing their music learning with us. There are approximately 95 children across the school learning a variety of instruments, we are looking forward to creating opportunities for children to share their learning with us.

This week and next Mr Oscar Adams is running a number of house based Olympic events. Fabulous to see Bowenvale taking two gold medals so far. We look forward to the video submissions and musical chairs.

Next week is NZ Maths week. The maths curriculum team have organised a number of activities for classes to join in. We have the opportunity for Y5 - 8 children to participate in a zone based Cantamaths competition on Monday. We will be walking down to Beckenham School to compete as school groups and then mixed teams. This week the Government shared with us that we will be receiving the new draft Maths curriculum this month. We are being asked to implement this new curriculum by the start of next year.



As a school we have been working with the draft curriculum before it was recalled. Our maths team look forward to seeing the changes and working together to put this curriculum into practice. The Government shared data in the weekend that 22% of Year 8 learners met the expectations of the new curriculum. Although we haven't looked at the new curriculum our mid year data shows that 82% of our Year 8s are meeting or above the expectations for this time of the year.

Good luck to the EPro8 teams competing in the semi finals this week, we hope you enjoy your new builds and the challenge of the competition.

'To create a positive climate and culture of belonging and engagement for all'

The focus for the first few weeks of Term 3 is being responsible for our own behaviour.

The topics being covered are -

- showing positive solution based behaviour through restorative practices
- being honest - if you make a mistake, do your best to fix it
- practising being a good sport person

As part of being responsible for our behaviour, classes have been working through skills to solve problems independently.

The skills involved work through steps to hold a restorative conversation. This includes giving each child an opportunity for uninterrupted sharing, understanding the impact of the behaviour on others and coming to a mutual agreement to move forward positively.

Posters have been placed around the school for children to refer to if needed.

As always, duty teachers are supervising at all break times if extra support is required.

CCC Graffiti Programme

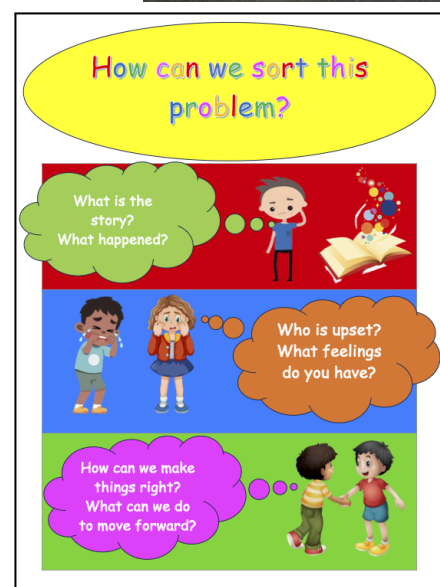
Early on in the year a group of students from St Martins were invited by the CCC Graffiti Programme to create a piece of art with an environmental message or theme.

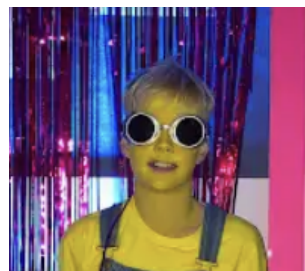
