



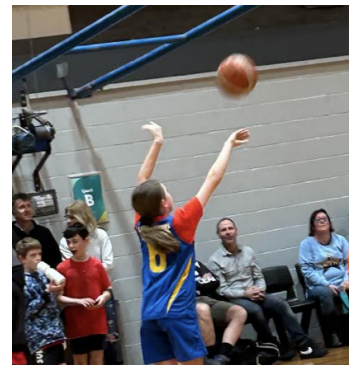

Great to have this lovely spring weather to be able to get outside and soak up the vitamin D with our friends. The Y7 / 8 William Pike group enjoyed the walk through our local hills yesterday, thanks to Briana for organising this and the whānau and kaiako supporting the event.

We have had another wonderful basketball season during the term. Congratulations to all of the children involved. Thank you to the parents who picked up the coaching and managing roles to support the players.

This week we welcome Frankie. We look forward to being a part of the St Martins | Hato Mātene whānau, the learning you will engage in and the contributions you will make.

A quick uniform reminder. If your child has hair over their collar this needs to be tied up. We do this for both health and safety reasons.

Last week in our assemblies we were talking about gratitude, being thankful for the things others do for us. This could be something our friends do, in the classroom being supported by our peers, an enjoyable teaching session or a reliever in the class. As a school we have stepped up on the sports field with the expectation of captains showing appreciation for the referee and team coaches. We are seeing and hearing this across the school. It could also be the small things that we model, thanking people at checkouts and counters so our tamariki can hear it in context often. We hope that this may also be carried into your home as well.

During the past few weeks we have been given the draft English and Maths curriculums. Our maths team has looked at the draft document, compared our current programme to the aspects we are being asked to

implement. We believe we are very much on the right track, making some adaptations to our current maths teaching and learning. In the next few weeks the literacy team will be meeting to do the same thing. This is a great opportunity to reflect on our current programmes and compare these to learning across the motu. We will be having a teacher only day on the first Monday of the holidays so all teachers are starting to build capacity to implement the new document frameworks.

Next term we will be completing our 2025 class organisation. Class placements involve a number of discussions to enable us to make the best decisions for each student. We take into consideration a number of factors, meeting together on numerous occasions to discuss the make-up of groupings.

At St Martins School | Hato Mātene we have mixed ability classes. We use the following definition for placing children: groups of children working at similar levels - with consideration of ages, social, behavioural and emotional aspects. As with previous years we extend an invitation to you, as parents, to make us aware of any information that might be relevant to the placement of your child / children. This is an opportunity to give us information that will help us with our process, rather than an invitation to select your child's 2024 teacher.
