PB4L

'To create a positive climate and culture of belonging and engagement for all'

For the remainder of the year each learning team has a different focus in response to the emerging needs being identified.

An underlying concept for PB4L is **self regulation** because it helps children learn, behave well and get along with others.

In its simplest form self regulation is having the ability to monitor and manage rising emotions or energy levels that result from either external experiences and/or internal thoughts.

From awareness then comes the development and practice of healthy coping strategies. Self regulation strategies will look different for each age group. A google search will bring up many different activities to support families to foster these skills in their children at home.



We held our last PTA committee meeting for the year on Monday and made good progress with planning for 2025. We welcomed new committee member Amy Jones and acknowledged the resignation of our Secretary Robin Wilson. We were pleased to approve funding of \$5000 for Structured Literacy in 2025.
