### **2025 SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS**

#### Timeline & Important Information

Every three years all public schools in Aotearoa hold elections for their School Boards, 2025 is an election year.

The School Board is made up of parent elected individuals and is a key part of St Martins School, they govern a lot of important things behind the scenes that are really important in keeping our school running.

While no specific experience is required it is appreciated that SMS is a high performing school and board members

performing school and board members should show a willingness to contribute, collaborate, and uphold the values of our school. We especially

encourage nominations from individuals with experience in:

- Governance
- Finance
- Risk & compliance

## What Does a Board Member Do?

At St Martins School the Board governs the school. Working together to ensure our students thrive within a supportive, high-quality learning environment. This involves:

- Supporting the Principal
- Consults with the community on important issues
- Setting the strategic direction

- Ensuring alignment with Te Tiriti o Waitangi
- Oversees finances and property
- Monitoring policy and compliance

### Time Commitment

Board members attend around 8 board meetings per year and should allow time for reading board papers and staying informed. On average, members can expect to commit approximately 6-8 hours per month. Attendance at key school events is also encouraged.

### How to Apply

To stand as a candidate, you must complete a nomination form. **Nominations open this Friday 18th July. A link** to the online nomination form will be emailed to all school caregivers on this date.


