Reminder of processing timeframes for school account payments

Thank you for all fee and school event payments received so far this year. We appreciate all your contributions as it all helps us to provide a wide range of opportunities to students. A few reminders regarding paying fees:

- We aim to add the majority of term costs to your Hero account by the end of week two each term, sometimes it can take longer than expected and some event costs will be added closer to the start date of the event. We encourage you to regularly check your hero account for updates.
- If you receive a classroom notice that states a cost, you are welcome to pay it in advance, but please allow a minimum of 1 week from payment for it to be added to your Hero account.
- Our preferred payment for fees / donations is online via our school account number: 12-3240-0111723-00 (ref child's name/event) or by EFTPOS at the school office.
- School donations are tax deductible for a 33% refund, please see Megan in the school office if you need information on how to do this.
- Occasionally a charge is applied in error. If your child did not attend an event we have billed you for, please email our office on <u>accounts@stmartins.school.nz</u> to have it reversed.
