We have a new English and Maths curriculum. These have changed slightly from the ones we originally thought we would be working with. Our English and Maths curriculum leaders will be looking at these, making recommendations and finalising any adaptations for the new year. We continue to wait for direction from the Government around proposed changes for assessment and reporting, this year we will continue with our usual cycle, if we are updated again we will look at what needs to be developed for 2026.
